www.bullying.org is a multiple award-winning, non-profit Internet resource that was created to help people around the world deal with the issue of bullying. Listed as the number one Web site by most major Internet search engines and with nearly one million visitors each month, www.bullying.org is the number one bullying-referenced Web site in the world.

www.bullying.org is a supportive international community where people can learn that they are NOT alone in being bullied, that being bullied is NOT their fault and that they CAN do something positive about it.

People can contribute their personal stories, poems, images, oral stories (audio files), music, animations and movies. They can also search our extensive list of helpful resources.

www.bullying.org also has two moderated, online support groups, one for youth and one for adults.

Working along with our partners, Bullying.org launched the first ever National Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week.

We also created and maintain the "Peer Power" and "Community Solutions" networks that enable individuals and groups at the local level to share ideas, projects, resources and programs with others.

Bullying.org Canada Inc. currently offers four different 90 minute multimedia presentations that have been shared across Canada and around the world.

The name Bullying.org Canada Inc. is formally recognized by the Government of Canada. It is supported by a Board of Directors and we have recently applied to the Canadian Revenue Agency for Charitable tax status.

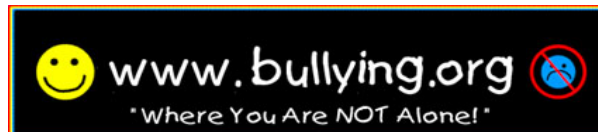
